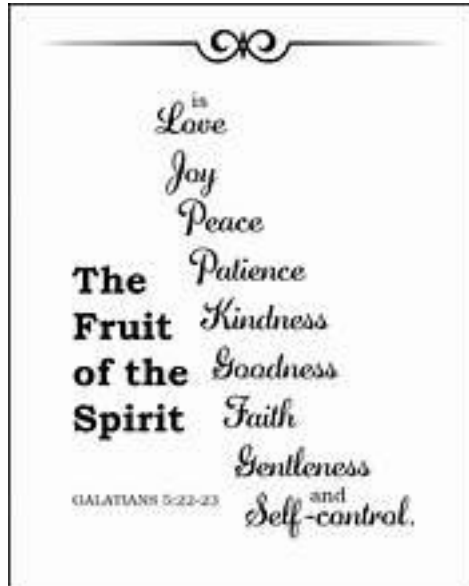

Welcome to New Goshenhoppen Church!

While elaborating on loving one's neighbor, apologist Michael Ramsden spoke of a colleague who while in Asia asked his audience to close their eyes and imagine peace. After a few seconds the audience was invited to share their mental pictures of peace. One person described a field with flowers and beautiful trees. Another person spoke of snow-capped mountains and an incredible alpine landscape. Still another described the scene of a beautiful, still lake.

After everyone described their mental picture of peace there was one thing common in them all --- there were no people in them. Ramsden commented, "isn't it interesting, when asked to imagine peace the first thing we do is to eliminate everyone else."

Peace is not the absence of trouble or others. This morning, we will explore the fruit of "Peace."

The organ preludes are two pieces which are very different. The first is arranged by Janet Linker of John Ness Beck's, *When Peace Like a River* which we will sing during the service. The second piece written by Langlais – *The Chant of Peace* – peace is not found in the composition until the last chord.

Today is approximately 50 days before Easter – it is called in the Latin – Quintagesima. The color for the "Gesima" Sundays is purple. It signifies penitence, preparation, mourning, humiliation, and the passion.

HILLEGASS SCHOLARSHIP FUND OPPORTUNITY: Through the generosity of the Foster C. and Florence (Moll) Hillegass Scholarship Fund, New Goshenhoppen U.C.C. is able to grant financial assistance to members of the congregation who have decided to further their education. The Scholarship Awards are for post high school students working for an undergraduate degree at an accredited school. 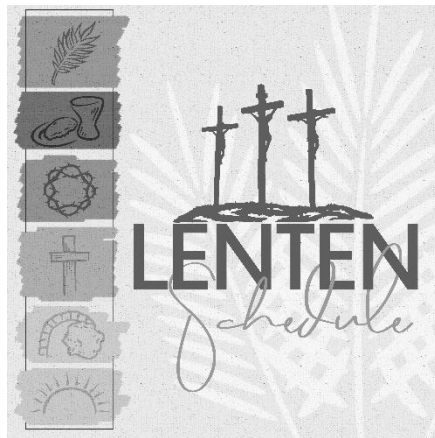


