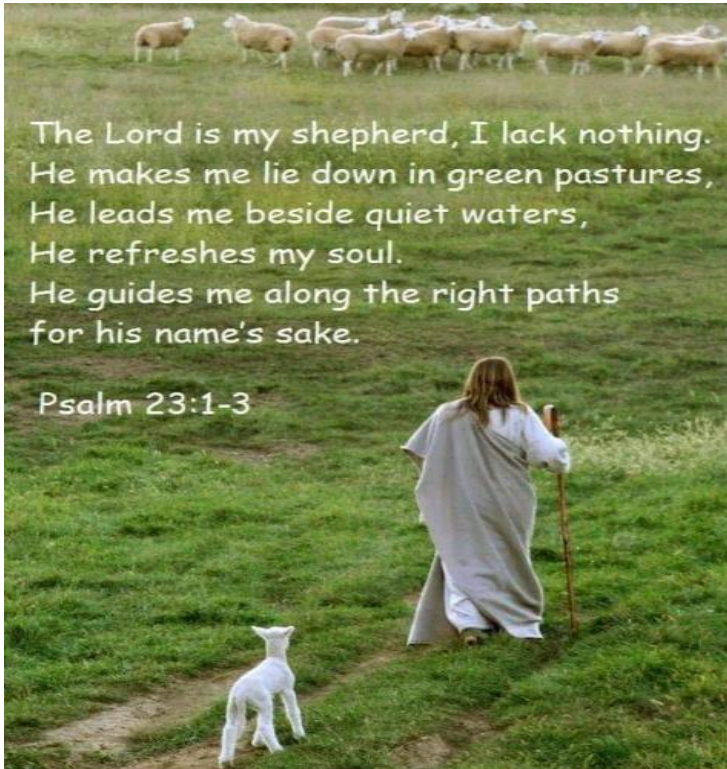

Welcome to New Goshenhoppen Church

Lynn Austin writes: *"Faith don't come in a bushel basket, Missy. It comes one step at a time. Decide to trust Him, for one little thing today, and before you know it, you will find out He's so trustworthy you'll be putting your whole life in His hands."*

The 23rd Psalm leads us to embracing God, who is the holy center and well spring of life under the Shepherd's care. There are three things that must be working within us before we can truly experience the sufficiency of God: faith, death to self, and agape love. When faith, death to self, and love are alive in you, you will find that hope and joy pervade your entire life as a natural result. Each one is a gift from God, and our privilege and calling is to become the kind of people who can receive these gifts and work with God to develop them as we learn to live a life without lack.

Faith – trust – is the key that unlocks our readiness to receive God's sufficiency in our lives. To have faith in God is simply to trust God, to rely upon Him in the face of all fears.

The best-known definition of faith in the Bible is this: "Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen" [Hebrews 11:1]. Substance means what stands under something [sub-stance or under-standing]. Faith is the substance of things hoped for in this way: when we have faith, we act in relationship with God to bring what we hope for into reality. Faith is also "the evidence of things not seen." What are the "things not seen?" In the same passage, we are told that the "worlds were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible [Hebrews 11:3]. When we have faith, that is sure evidence that the word of the unseen God is active in us. Faith is a gift; God creates it in our hearts.

Job 1:1-12

There was a man in the land of Uz whose name was Job, and that man was blameless and upright, one who feared God and turned away from evil. ²There were born to him seven sons and three

daughters. ³ He possessed 7,000 sheep, 3,000 camels, 500 yoke of oxen, and 500 female donkeys, and very many servants, so that this man was the greatest of all the people of the east. ⁴ His sons used to go and hold a feast in the house of each one on his day, and they would send and invite their three sisters to eat and drink with them. ⁵ And when the days of the feast had run their course, Job would send and consecrate them, and he would rise early in the morning and offer burnt offerings according to the number of them all. Pastor and People

One: Members and friends in Christ, we gather now to celebrate the gift of grace in the Sacrament of Baptism.

All: There is one body and one Spirit. There is one hope in God's call to us.

One: There is one Lord, one faith, one Baptism, one God and Father of us all. Dearly beloved, Baptism is an outward and visible sign of the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, through which grace we become partakers of his righteousness and heirs of life eternal. Those receiving the Sacrament are thereby marked as Christian disciples, and initiated into the fellowship of Christ's holy Church. *Our Lord has expressly given to little children a place among the people of God, which holy privilege must not be denied them. Remember the words of the Lord Jesus Christ, how he said, "Let the children come to me, do not hinder them; for to such belongs the kingdom of God."*
