In a 2015 interview, the Hungarian composer György Kurtág made a remarkable confession about his struggle to reconcile his atheism with the beauty of Bach's music:

Consciously, I am certainly an atheist, but I do not say it out loud, because if I look at Bach, I cannot be an atheist. Then I have to accept the way he believed. His music never stops praying. And how can I get closer if I look at him from the outside? I do not believe in the Gospels in a literal fashion, but a Bach fugue has the Crucifixion in it—as the nails are being driven in. In music, I am always looking for the hammering of the nails ... That is a dual vision. My brain rejects it all. But my brain isn't worth much.

As we hear the music this day, may your heart open to hear the beauty of God's heart singing over you!

¹⁹ On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." ²⁰ When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. ²¹ Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." ²² And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³ If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld."

Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed."

³⁰ Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; ³¹ but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name. ³

Sleep Out for Somebody Youth Event

WHAT: Sleep Out for Somebody Youth Event Friday, May 2 @ 6 pm - Saturday, May 3, 2025 @ 8 am.

WHERE: St. Mark's Lutheran Church 81 N. Main Street, Pennsburg, PA 18073

BACKGROUND: The Sleep Out for Somebody Youth Event is an educational, faithforming and fundraising event. Youth will learn about the challenges that kids and adults face with homelessness. We are also raising money to support the Upper Perkiomen Valley Homelessness Coalition.

The idea is to raise both awareness and funds. The plan is to build cardboard shelters on the lawn next to the church, and sleep in them overnight. Each participant will be expected to find sponsors – but there is no minimum amount required to participate, and there is no registration fee. We are working with the Open Link, Access Services and the Homelessness Coalition to plan a program of speakers, games, activities, and a service project that will help educate youth about the reality of homelessness, but also be fun and engaging.

There is a registration flyer and an information sheet for youth leaders attached. Once folks have registered we will send a sponsor sheet.

This is the first time that we are trying something like this – so even if your youth decide not to take part, we hope you will pray for us!
